The Cougars play at The Citadel at 6:00 ... Citadel leads the series 30-24 ... CofC has won the last five meetings ... Charleston has won 14 of the last 20 meetings overall and eight of its last 10 vs. The Citadel at Riley Park ... Charleston was 4-0 against the Bulldogs last season, all at Riley Park ... Coach John Pawlowski is 18-15 all-time vs. the Bulldogs ... 11-9 at Riley Park ... 6-4 at Patriots Point ... 1-2 at Remley's Point ...

• Nationally Ranked In Runs

The Cougars are currently second nationally averaging 13.2 runs per game ... CofC has scored at least 20 runs on three occasions ... Charleston has two of the nation's top scoring games this season ... Charleston's 28 runs in its 28-14 win over George Mason is the highest scoring output by a school this spring ... CofC's 26-8 win over Savannah State is tied for the nation's third highest total ... Arizona State leads the nation averaging 14.7 runs per outing ... the NCAA single-season record is 12.06 runs per game by Wichita State in 1998 ...

• Wall of Fame

The College of Charleston will induct former players Lee Curtis and Sam Moore into its Baseball Wall of Fame later this season ... Curtis and Moore join Billy Colome, Joey Foxhall, Travis

Howell, Monte Lee and Scott Oliver as the only members of the school's Wall of Fame ... Colome, Foxhall, Howell, Lee and Oliver were the inaugural inductees in 2004 ... the Wall of Fame is located on the left field fence at Patriots Point Stadium ... a banner that hangs for each player includes his name, jersey number and years played.

• Noting Charleston

The Cougars are 10-3 after a 4-1 week ... hitting .365 (181-496) as a team with 35 doubles, three triples and 35 homers ... scored 170 runs ... averaging 13.9 hits and 13.1 runs per game ... have scored at least 20 runs three times, twice last week ... have a .659 slugging percentage467 on base percentage ... Gabe Marchant is batting a team-leading .455 with six homers and 21 runs batted in ... SS Mike Hentz is hitting .381 with four homers and 14 RBI ... Hentz is 4-5 in SB ... Michael Kohn is batting .340 with six homers and 21 RBI ...

• Wind Aided

40+ MPH winds in Saturday's DH with Texas-San Antonio contributed to a pair of football-like scores ... the Roadrunners won 20-12 in the opener ... CofC won 20-16 in the nightcap ... the two schools combined for 68 runs, 67 hits and 12 homers ... without the wind, Charleston won the finale 9-4 ...

• RBI Record

1B Michael Harrington set a school

record with eight RBIs in Charleston's 20-16 win over UTSA ... Harrington hit a second inning grand slam, a three-run homer in Charleston 9-run sixth inning and he broke the record with a run-producing groundout later in the same inning ... for the season, he's hitting .411 with a club-leading seven homers and 26 RBI over 13 games ...

• **Mike Tice**

Junior 3B Mike Tice hit .412 with two homers, nine runs scored and five RBI in five games ... for the season, he's hitting .370 with four homers and 14 RBI ...

• **Jake Golberg**

RHP Jake Goldberg improved to 1-1 on the season, and 7-2 over the past two seasons in Sunday's 9-4 win over UTSA ... he didn't allow an earned run on just five hits with eight strikeouts over 6 1/3 innings ... he leads the team with a 2.95 ERA...

• **Closer**

RHP Jesse Simpson is 2-1 with two saves and a 3.86 ERA as the team's closer ... he's averaging 17.4 strikeouts per nine innings ... he's got 18 punchouts over 9 1/3 innings.

• **Record Setting Day**

Charleston set a school record for most runs in a game in its 28-14 win over George Mason on Feb. 23 ...the Cougars tied their single-game mark for homers (6) and hits (28) in the win ... CofC and GMU combined for two CofC single-game team records: 42 runs scored and 10 homers (CofC 6, GMU 4) in the game ... the two schools combined for 18 homers in the twinbill (CofC 10, GMU 8) ...

• **Back-To-Back-To-Back-To-Back**

College of Charleston has won four consecutive SoCon titles ... Charleston won regular season crowns in 2004, 2005 and 2007 ... the Cougars won the 2006 SoCon Tournament championship ...

• **2007 Lookback**

The Cougars shared the Southern Conference regular season title after finishing 2007 with a 39-19 overall record and a 20-7 league mark ... it was the fourth straight season of at least 20 league wins, the longest stretch in SoCon history ... CofC won 25 SoCon games in 2004, a league-record 27 in 2005 and 20 in 2006 ... the Cougars led the nation with a .350 team batting average, runs per game at 9.5 and team slugging percentage at .570 ...

• **Preseason Predictions**

The Cougars have been selected by the league's coaches and media to repeat as Southern Conference regular season champions ... Michael Harrington earned preseason All-SoCon honors ... Harrington hit .364 with 13 home runs and 66 RBI in 2007 ...

• **Home-Sweet-Home**

Patriots Point recently underwent a \$3 million renovation ... the renovated baseball facility features covered seating, an expanded press box with two radio booths and a hospitality deck ... the softball and baseball facilities have new scoreboards, which include a full-color message center ... CofC is 167-66 (.717, 8th season) all-time at Patriots Point Stadium ... CofC is 70-32 in SoCon games (.686) ...

• **180 Overall Wins**

CofC's 180 wins (180-67) over the past four seasons is the most in SoCon history ... the Cougars were 47-16 in 2004, 48-15 in 2005, 46-17 in 2006 and 39-19 in 2007 ...

• **CofC Baseball All-Time**

The Cougars are 524-390-2 (.573) in their 18th season since resuming baseball in 1991 ... CofC played baseball until the 1948 season ...

• **Two-Out Magic**

The Cougars are batting .391 with two outs and have driven in 72 runs with two down ... Michael Kohn leads Charleston with 12 two-out RBI ...

Head Coach John Pawlowski is in his ninth season as head coach at the College of Charleston. He's led the Cougars to a 309-175-1 record over his first eight seasons at the helm.

Pawlowski captured his 300th career coaching victory in Charleston's 10-9 win over George Mason on Opening Day.

Pawlowski, 44, has spent 15 years coaching on the college ranks after an eight-year professional career with the White Sox, Angels and Orioles.

He's led Charleston to a 180-67 record over the past four seasons, the most in school and Southern Conference history for a four-year span.

In 2007, the Cougars won their fourth consecutive Southern Conference title finishing with an overall record of 39-19 and 20-7 in league play. The Cougars led the nation in batting average and runs scored per game. The Cougars finished fourth in the nation in home runs.

Pawlowski led Charleston to unprecedented heights in 2006. Charleston, which posted a 46-17 overall record and a 20-7 league mark, finished ranked as high as 12th nationally after winning the school's first Southern Conference Tournament title and the NCAA Lexington Regional championship. The Cougars played at Georgia Tech in the Atlanta Super Regional.

Junior righty Nick Chigges earned All-America honors after posting an 11-2 record. It also marked the third consecutive season a Cougar has claimed the SoCon Pitcher of the Year award.

Pawlowski was named the 2005

Southern Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Cougars to their second straight SoCon title. Charleston finished with a 43-15 overall record and a 27-3 league mark. Both records are the best in school and league history. The Cougars have the fourth most wins (95) and second highest winning percentage over the past two seasons (.754) over the past two seasons. CofC finished ranked No. 22 by Collegiate baseball magazine and participated in the Clemson Regional.

Pawlowski was again named the 2004 Southern Conference Coach of the Year after leading Charleston to a 47-16 overall record, a 25-5 conference mark, a No. 29 ranking by Collegiate Baseball magazine, the school's first Southern Conference championship and the first NCAA Regional appearance in Cougar history.

Charleston's 47 overall wins and 25 league victories were the most in Southern Conference history. The Cougars finished second in the Baton Rouge Regional reaching "Championship Sunday" against top-seed LSU after wins over Army and Southern Mississippi.

Pawlowski's Cougars led the Southern Conference in batting average (.325), runs scored (535), hits (760), RBIs (475), hit



by pitches (122), sacrifice bunts (94), triples (23), total bases (1,080), on base percentage (.431), stolen bases (112) and slugging percentage (.485). Pawlowski's pitching staff posted a 3.40 ERA and led the SoCon with five shutouts, as well as, opponents batting average (.268) and saves (19).

Ten College of Charleston players earned either first or second team All-Southern Conference honors, while five players were represented a total of seven times on various All-American teams (Baseball America, Louisville Slugger/Collegiate Baseball, National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and CollegeBaseballInsider.com). Phillip Coker (2nd team) and Brett Anderson (3rd team) earned CoSIDA Academic All-American honors.

The Cougars ranked second nationally in team batting average, eighth in runs scored per game (8.5), 10th in winning percentage (.746) and seventh in total victories. Charleston enjoyed a school-record 15-game winning streak, the fourth longest in 2004 nationally. CofC's 18-6 road mark was the third best in the nation.

Charleston, which finished 31-27 in 2003, posted a 36-22 record in 2002 and reached the finals of the Southern Conference Tournament.

He worked as an assistant coach under Pat Murphy at Arizona State in 1999 where his primary duties were recruiting and tutoring the Sun Devils pitching staff. The Sun Devils finished with a 39-21 record and a 4.54 team ERA, the lowest mark for the pitching staff in six years. ASU hurlers struck out 507 hitters in 526 1/3 innings while walking only 243.

The Sun Devils finished second only to conference champion Stanford in team ERA, while posting a 12-12 league mark and a fifth place finish in the Pac-10 standings.

Prior to his stint with ASU, Pawlowski worked at his alma mater, Clemson, as pitching coach and assistant recruiting coordina-

tor from 1994 to 1998. During that time, the Tigers made five consecutive NCAA regional appearances and two trips to the College World Series (1995 and 1996). The Tigers were ACC Champions in 1994 and 1995. Clemson averaged 46 wins from 1994 to 1998.

Pawlowski's pitching staff ranked first in the nation for team ERA (3.03) in 1996. That year, two of his pupils were first round draft picks Kris Benson (No. 1 pick to the Pittsburgh Pirates) and Billy Koch (No. 4 pick to the Toronto Blue Jays). Clemson had 15 pitchers drafted during his tenure as pitching coach. The Tigers recruiting classes ranked in the top 10 nationally in each of his five years on staff.

A former major leaguer, Pawlowski pitched in the Chicago White Sox organization from 1985 to 1991. He also had stints in the California Angels (1991-92) and Baltimore Orioles (1992) organizations.

He received his bachelor's degree in Industrial Education from Clemson University in May of 1996.

Pawlowski earned his first collegiate win during freshman season against rival South Carolina when he allowed five hits over five scoreless innings in Clemson's 8-0 win. For the year he posted a 5-6 mark with a 4.60 ERA. He pitched against the likes of Florida, Florida State, Alabama, Georgia and North Carolina twice.

As a sophomore, he led the club with four saves and 22 appearances becoming then only the seventh pitcher in Clemson history to appear in over 20 games in a season. He finished with a 7-3 record and 2.71 earned run average. In 73 innings, he allowed only 58 hits and 22 earned runs, while walking 25 and striking out 55.

He bounced back from a broken forearm suffered during fall workouts to post a 9-3 record and 4.26 ERA as a junior in 1985. He pitched in 17 games, all starts, working 107 2/3 innings surrendering 105 hits, 73 runs, 51

earned runs, while walking 51 and striking out 72. He led the team with five complete games and two shutouts.

He finished his three-year Tiger career with a 21-12 record and a 3.89 ERA over 54 games. He made 30 career starts working 240 1/3 innings with eight complete games, three shutouts and five saves.

He was the sixth-round draft pick of the Chicago White Sox in 1985.

Pawlowski moved quickly up the professional ranks and made his major league debut in September of 1987. He earned his first major league win on April 22, 1988 when recently inducted Hall of Famer Carlton Fisk homered in the bottom of the 10th inning in a 7-5 win over the Oakland A's.

After playing over eight years and for four organizations, Pawlowski returned to Clemson to begin his coaching career and complete his degree.

Pawlowski signed with Clemson after a brilliant career at Seton Catholic Central High School in Binghamton, N.Y. where he was a four-year letter winner and three-time all-conference selection in baseball, and a two-time letter winner in basketball.

He caught the eye of legendary Clemson coach Bill Wilhelm in one of the Tigers' summer camps in 1981. As a senior he named the school's outstanding student-athlete, while posting a 5-4 record with a 1.88 ERA. He went 8-3 with a 1.20 ERA during his final summer of legion baseball.

Pawlowski, an avid runner, competed in his seventh marathon this past fall.

The Johnson City, New York native graduated from Seton Catholic Central in Binghamton, N.Y. in 1982. In 2007, he was inducted into the Upstate New York Section IV Hall of Fame.

Pawlowski has three daughters, Christine (16), Mary Louise (13) and Jenny Caroline (7).
